<b>Purpose of Paper:</b>	Discussion, Information and Assurance
<b>Summary:</b>  The attached report is an update on the key areas for Primary Care Development as set out in the CCGs transformation programme and Operational Plan.	
<b>Recommendation:</b>  The Governing Body is asked to:-  1. Note the position on co-commissioning with NHSE from 1 <sup>st</sup> April 2016, the situation with the PMS review and CCG process for managing PMS monies and on the Primary Care summit held on Wednesday 11 <sup>th</sup> November 2015.	

## **Primary Care Co Commissioning**

The Primary Care and Governance Leads across the 4 local CCGs covered by the Midlands and East (East) regional team: Norwich, North Norfolk, South Norfolk & West Norfolk; have agreed to work together on a coordinated approach for the submission of our individual applications for Joint Commissioning. In particular, in respect of implementing the necessary governance arrangements for the Joint Committee. In addition it is hoped that this approach will also reduce duplication of effort for our colleagues in our local NHSE Primary Care team.

The CCG Primary Care Leads and regional Primary Care team have arranged a meeting to discuss our respective current role and responsibilities from which we can make an informed assessment of the potential workload for both sides. In addition the Primary Care and Governance Leads of the 4 CCGs plan to meet in early December to begin the process of drawing a roadmap to consider the option of taking full delegated commissioning from 1 April 2017.

The CCG is currently awaiting NHSE independent audit of CCG management of co-commissioning conflicts of interest (COI) to inform our own COI policies.

The CCG is on track with its preparation and planning for the establishment of a Joint Committee from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016, and with the work on the primary care strategy, 5 Year Forward View and work with the membership be in a position to implement a clear work programme taking advantage of the opportunities presented by co-commissioning and also mitigating threats.

## **PMS Review**

The CCG is still to receive CCG-level information on funds for reinvestment following the outcomes from the PMS review and recent appeal panel.

In view of the recent advice from NHSE that in this first year (15/16) the funding for reinvestment is relatively low we are developing a process to assess initiatives against the principles agreed with our Council of Members. This will be coordinated through the Primary Care Development Group and reported to GB regularly.

## **Primary Care Summit**

The summit was held on 11 November 2015 and was well attended, by virtually all Norwich practices, both GP and managerially. The key objectives for the day were:-

- To understand the impact and urgency introduced by the NHS Five Year Forward View – New Models of Care, timeframes, threats and opportunities for primary care.
- Understand the current local health system across Norwich and Norfolk – threats and opportunities.
- Explore ideas on how New Models of Care could support Primary Care - managing sustainability, growth and demand.
- Agree a direction of travel for Norwich CCG and the future of Primary Care - what model is right for Norwich and next steps.

The event was facilitated by Attain Commissioning Service, speakers set out the national, regional and local context from the 5 Year Forward View:-

**National overview:** Policy context -The aims and objectives of the FYFV, the purpose of the New Models of Care and National enablers. Followed by Q&A - Richard Humphries, Assistant Director - Policy, the King's Fund

**Local overview:** Current health system – what's working well in Norwich CCG, what areas need further support across the system and the joint working arrangements, and areas the CCG could further support Primary Care – Jo Smithson, CEO & Tracy Williams, Governing Body Chair – Norwich CCG

**Current integration** and out of hospital care work within Norwich e.g. YourNorwich and across the system Director of Integrated Services, Norwich - Norfolk County Council & NCHC Integrated Care.

**Overview of practical examples of New Models of Care** - Martin Wilson, Executive Chair - Attain Commissioning Services

**The LMC view:** GP contract and what the future could look like for general practice.

**Local threats and opportunities:** What could the local health system look like: Perspective of local GPs.

Between presentations there were independently facilitated table discussions on the issues and pressures facing the Norwich system and during the final session identification of possible solutions.

Although the outcome of the summit was positive with considerable common agreement on concerns and potential areas for development and in particular a strong sense of any model should be built on the Norwich footprint, the next steps and detailed work streams, it was agreed that Practices and the CCG would need a short period of reflection, with potential next steps to be discussed initially at the November at the Council of Members meeting. From that more detailed plans with timescales and supporting resources will be developed.
